Ron Dimmer requested the Council to annex his property at the end of Nantz Street. He stated that he did not know he needed to install a grinder pump station for each house. City staff explained the grinder pump requirement.

Jerry Hatton, engineer, presented three alternatives for a regional waste water plant, with Mount Holly, Belmont, Cramerton, and C-MUD as participants. Mr. Hatton indicated that we would be getting a draft outlining the choices.

Council agreed to accept public bids for no less than \$27,500 to purchase the city property on Henry Street, formerly the location of the Catawba Heights water office.

Council decided to put the possible purchase of the Second Baptist Church property on the March regular meeting.

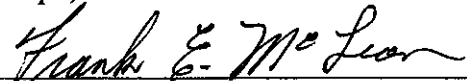
