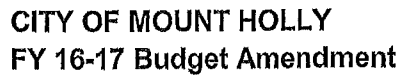

The blockage could not be dislodged. The 8" clay siphon sewer line under Dutchman's Creek will be replaced with a directional bore of an 8" SDR9-HDPE pipe. The price of \$389,000 includes the directional bore, tie-ins, and a HDPE sewer pump around to ensure no interruption in service

A 60 yr old + siphon under the Dutchmans has become blocked and is leaking.
Our equipment and contractors equipment failed to dislodge the blockage.

Evidence of the blockage is verified with no flow in the downstream MH.

Evidence of flow being released from the siphon was noticed. This is a reportable incident to the State.

Our first action is to install a bypass.

A quote was obtained from the third company contacted. The other two could not do the work.

The siphon has to be replaced due to the unmovable blockage and apparent pipe leak.

The quote (a maximum) upset is \$389,000.

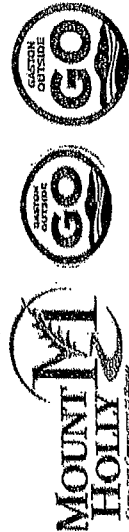

Background/Purpose of Request : The City posted a Request for Qualifications on August 24, 2020 for Highway Landscape/Planting Design Services. The Statement of Qualifications were due on September 17, 2020 at 2:00 PM. The City had two firms submit Statements of Qualifications for the project. A review and selection committee was comprised of Planning Staff, Streets and Solid Waste Staff and the City Engineer. After review and discussion of the qualification packages the selection committee selected Stimmel as the most qualified firm to perform the greenway corridor survey. Funds were appropriated in the FY 20-21 budget within the Planning Department which will be utilized for this project. The project area will be focused on the grassed medians within the area of Highway 273 (South Main Street) where NCDOT is currently widening the road to four lanes. The firms who submitted qualifications were McAdams and Stimmel Associates. The determining factors that lead to the selection of Stimmel are as follows: - Show a greater amount of experience with NCDOT landscaping projects; - Show experience working within NCDOT right-of-ways; - Certified under many NCDOT work codes; - Fully responded to the Request for Qualifications; - The ability to be present/local to Mount Holly and workload availability.

City further acknowledges that City is in receipt of the following: (I) original River Park Subdivision Agreement, Phases 2 & 3, Lots 41-70, 80-87, 100-103, & 108-111, executed by CW and SDH Development Company LLC (the "SDH Agreement"); and (II) original Performance Bond (as defined in the SDH Agreement).

City hereby agrees that Walton shall be automatically released from all liabilities and obligations under the Walton Agreement and the Performance Bond (as defined in the Walton Agreement) effective upon recording of the Plats and the Deed in the Gaston County Register of Deeds (the "Closing"). City further agrees to return the original Performance Bond (as defined in the Walton Agreement) to Walton within ten (10) days after receipt of written notice of the Closing.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, that we, SDH Development Company LLC, a Georgia Limited Liability Company and CW-Vernon, LLC, a Delaware Limited Liability Company as Principals, and Lexon Insurance Company, licensed to do business in the State of North Carolina, as Surety, are held and firmly bound unto City of Mount Holly (Obligee), in the penal sum of One Hundred Eighty Three Thousand Nine Hundred Fifty Eight and 80/100 Dollars (\$183,958.80), lawful money of the United States of America, for the payment of which sum, well and truly to be made, the Principals and Surety do bind themselves, their heirs, executors, administrators, and successors and assigns, jointly and severally, firmly by these presents.

THE CONDITION OF THIS OBLIGATION IS SUCH, that whereas the above bounden Principals has entered into a certain written Contract with the above named Obligee, effective the ____ day of December, ____ and terminating the ____ day of November, 2019, for River Park Subdivision Phases 2 and 3 and more fully described in said Contract, a copy of which is attached, which Agreement is made a part hereof and incorporated herein by reference, except that nothing said therein shall alter, enlarge, expand or otherwise modify the term of the bond as set out below.

NOW, THEREFORE, if Principals, their executors, administrators, successors and assigns shall promptly and faithfully perform the Contract, according to the terms, stipulations or conditions thereof, then this obligation shall become null and void, otherwise to remain in full force and effect. In the event that the Principals have failed to promptly and faithfully perform the Contract, the Surety shall, at its option, either perform the Contract in accordance with its terms and conditions or pay to the Obligee the amount of the bond penalty, or such amount that is necessary to cure such failure to perform. This bond is executed by the Surety and accepted by the Obligee subject to the following express condition:

Notwithstanding the provisions of the Contract, the term of this bond shall apply from 8th day of December, 2017, until 8th day of December, 2019, and will be extended by the Surety by Continuation Certificate annually, until such time as the work has been completed and accepted by the Obligee. However, neither nonrenewal by the Surety, nor the failure or inability of the Principals to file a replacement bond in the event of nonrenewal, shall itself constitute a loss to the obligee recoverable under this bond or any renewal or continuation thereof. The liability of the Surety under this bond and all continuation certificates issued in connection therewith shall not be cumulative and shall in no event exceed the amount as set forth in this bond or in any additions, riders, or endorsements properly issued by the Surety as supplements thereto.

Background/Purpose of Request: This is to adopt the updated Cleveland, Gaston, Lincoln Regional Plan. The update was a collaborative effort of county and municipal governments from Gaston, Cleveland and Lincoln Counties. Continued eligibility for North Carolina Disaster Relief Funding per North Carolina General Statutes, Chapter 166A: North Carolina Emergency Management Act and Section 322: Mitigation Planning of the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act mandates that NC Counties and Municipalities have an approved Hazard Mitigation Plan to receive state and federal assistance in the event of a declared disaster. Gaston County, including the municipalities, has been paired with both Cleveland and Lincoln Counties and its 1 municipalities due to adjoining boundaries and similar natural threats for the development of a Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan, and such regional hazard mitigation planning is a trend occurring across the State. The Cleveland Gaston Lincoln Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan incorporates specific planning details for each County and municipality. This Plan will be an update over the current Gaston County Multi- Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan, which is expiring, and the Act also mandates that Hazard Mitigation Plans be updated and adopted at least every five (5) years to maintain a current status.

**MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE
CITY OF MOUNT HOLLY, MUNICIPAL CORPORATION
AND DOMINION ENERGY NORTH CAROLINA**

THIS MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (hereinafter the “Memorandum”) made and entered into this 12th day of October, 2020, by and between the **City of Mount Holly (“City”)**, a **North Carolina municipal corporation**, and **Public Service Company of North Carolina, Incorporated dba Dominion Energy North Carolina, a South Carolina corporation (“Company”)** recognizes the mutual advantage of the creation of a coordinated effort to support the City’s and the Company’s energy goals and to state their intention to cooperate in accordance with the below stated objectives.

I. OVERVIEW

The City is responsible for protecting the public health and safety of its residents, which includes facilitating access to clean air, dependable and affordable energy, clean water and a livable environment.

The Company is a public natural gas utility regulated by the North Carolina Utilities Commission (“NCUC”) with a responsibility for providing safe, affordable and reliable natural gas service to its customers by means and at rates that are fair, just and reasonable as determined by the NCUC and in accordance with its North Carolina Tariff and applicable rules and regulations.

The City and the Company desire to work cooperatively to support the City’s and the Company’s energy goals as identified herein with the use of programs and innovative technologies associated with natural gas development, transportation and energy efficiency.

II. GOALS

Collaborating with the Company is key to achieving goals by harnessing emerging and innovative energy opportunities while also enhancing uptake of traditional energy programming such as energy efficiency.

The City acknowledges that the Company is interested in collaborating with the City to achieve its energy efficiency, renewable energy and affordable, safe and reliable energy goals. The Company seeks to become the most sustainable natural gas company in the country by achieving net zero emissions by 2050 and to reduce its methane emissions 65% by 2030 from the 2010 levels.

III. AREAS OF COLLABORATION

Collaborative opportunities between the City and the Company include, but may not be limited to, the following:

Energy Efficiency

The City and the Company will strive to develop a variety of energy efficiency options for all natural gas customers in the City, including residential, commercial, industrial, governmental and non-profit customers to achieve their goals. The City and the Company will work together to assist building owners with energy efficiency initiatives through energy use reports, benchmarking and evaluation of energy efficiency programs.

The Company currently offers various conservation programs that promote the more efficient use of natural gas and result in energy savings for its customers.

The Company will consider new opportunities, suggested by the City, to promote the efficient use of natural gas of new facilities constructed in the City.

The Company will also provide both municipal and community-wide natural gas usage data, reported in the aggregate, to the City on an annual basis. Specialized natural gas use data requests will be considered by the Company and evaluated in terms of cost-effectiveness and compliance with energy efficiency program conditions established by the NCUC.

Innovative Energy Technologies

The City and the Company will evaluate new technologies designed for more efficient utilization of natural gas where reduced greenhouse gas emissions and/or reduced air pollution emissions are realized.

The City and the Company will evaluate opportunities to collaborate on pilot applications to support enabling technologies that can help meet their goals. These pilot applications may provide a basis to evaluate broader adoption based on realized performance and benefits. The City and the Company will evaluate compressed natural gas ("CNG") as an alternative fuel for use in the City's large vehicle fleet and other transportation applications where significant improvements in air pollution emissions and/or greenhouse gas emissions can be achieved and projects are deemed financially feasible.

Renewable Natural Gas (RNG)

The City and the Company will evaluate options to advance the use of Renewable Natural Gas ("RNG"). RNG is recognized as a positive development for helping reduce greenhouse gas ("GHG") emissions by repurposing biogas to biomethane. Biomethane or RNG can be blended with natural gas and used to heat homes, provide energy for businesses, or used as an alternative transportation fuel.

RNG results in a net reduction in greenhouse gases when considering emissions savings from methane capture relative to its combustion. The City and the Company will encourage the use of RNG for use by natural gas customers. The City and the Company will evaluate (where applicable) the use of RNG for municipal transportation purposes, otherwise known as Renewable Natural Gas Vehicles ("RNGV").

The City and the Company will evaluate developing sources of RNG production at City-owned facilities.

IV. COMMITMENT OF COOPERATION

The City and the Company intend to work together in good faith to develop and implement projects and programs to help the City and the Company achieve their goals.

The City and the Company agree that this Memorandum of Understanding provides a non-binding framework for developing more formal cooperative plans and programs for natural gas customers. This non-binding Memorandum of Understanding is effective upon signing by both the City and Company and shall inform cooperation for a ten-year period, or until updated by both parties.

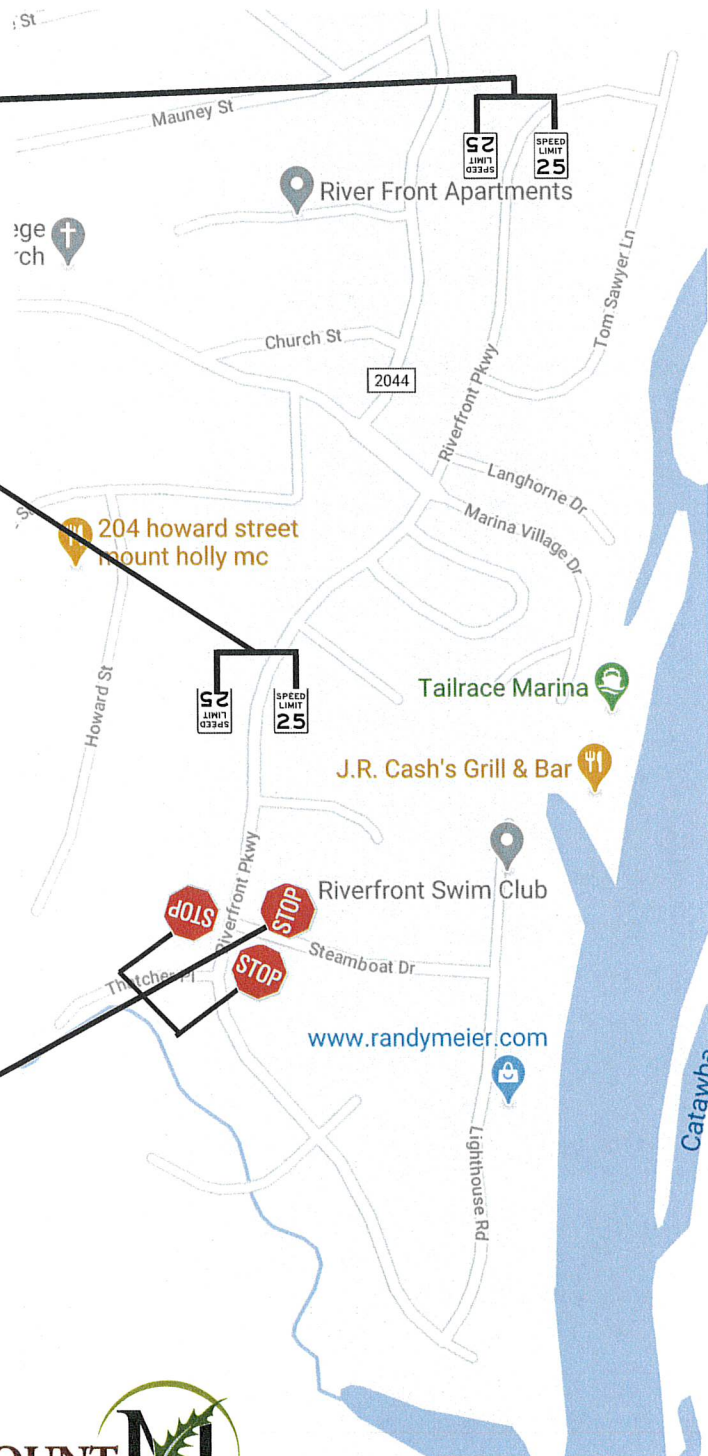
